Gentlemen,

It is my pleasure to submit for your approval, the happenings in baseball during the past year.

EIGHTEENTH ANNUAL CONFERENCE

The Conference was held at the Perth Oval, Lord St. Perth on Thursday October 11, 1962 at 1.30pm.

Present J. V. Quackenbush (Chairman), D. Boyce (NSW), J. Anderson (Vic) W. Moody (SA), A. Dempster (Q'land), R. Gordon (WA) and J. E. Ellis (Secretary/Treasurer)

Items dealt with during the Conference included-

Ron Sharpe Trophy

A trophy was received from the Helms Athletic Foundation in America and was accepted by the Australian Baseball Council. The trophy is to honour Mr. Ron Sharpe of the South Australian League who was for many years prominent in Interstate baseball, and will be awarded to the player judged the best in the Championship Series.

South African Visit

As the result of an approach by the South African Baseball Board, it was decided to advise South Africa that the A.B.C. is in favour of such a visit subject to satisfactory arrangements being able to be made.

1963 Series

Queensland Association was given permission to conduct the Series in Brisbane commencing July 25, 1963.

National Baseball Congress of America

It was decided not to affiliate further with this body.

Under 16 Competition

(a) That as from 1963, an Australian team of 12 players be selected and announced at the conclusion of each Series, provided that not less than 3 States compete.

(b) That players selected in such team be presented with an Australian Blazer pocket designed with the map of Australia outlined in gold with the words "Australian Under 16 Baseball Team" shown therein, and subject to the condition that no player be eligible to be presented with more than one pocket from this Series.

(c) That New South Wales Union prepare a draft Constitution for presentation and ratification by the A.B.C.

Reprint of Rules

It was decided to print 6000 Rule Books to include the latest amendments to the Rules.

Travel Pool

Agreement was reached on a method of financing the "pool" whereby each State contributed an equal share of the total fares required to be met each year, and to be reimbursed to the extent of fares required to be met in the same year.

History of Baseball

It was resolved that a move be made to publish a book covering the history of baseball, with New South Wales to prepare a suggested format for the book.

Executive Committee

It was decided that Delegates to the Council Conference each year should form an Executive Committee for the ensuing 12 months to make decisions on matters which could arise between Conferences.

Under 18 Series

It was decided that the conditions covering the Jim Brown Shield competition be varied by deleting the requirement that participants be schoolboys.

Field Games

An effort will be made to re-introduce field games on an International basis.

President 1963

The President of the Queensland Baseball Association to be President of the Australian Baseball Council for the 12 months commencing April 1, 1963

Honorary Secretary/Treasurer

Mr. J. Ellis declared himself not available for re-election and R. J. Black of Victoria was elected.

Australian Selection Committee

The 1963 Australian Selection Committee was C. Rowe (S.A.), J. Anderson (Vic), A. Dempster (Q'land), T. Halligan (N.S.W.) and T. Smith (W.A.)

Manager Australian Team 1963

The Council appointed Mr. Lyle Jones of South Australia as manager of the 1963 Australian Baseball Team.

Affiliation Fees

It was resolved that as from 1963, the Affiliation Fee due by each State be increased from £5- 5- 0 to £10-10- 0.

AUSTRALIAN BASEBALL CHAMPIONSHIPS

The 1963 Championships were held in Perth, and the West Australian League is congratulated on the successful staging of the games. The Series extended from October 12 to 21, with all games played at the Perth Oval, and was officially opened by the American Consul, Mr. Thomas Mayfield.

Due to the tight baseball programme, the Social activities were restricted to the Championship Ball, but I am sure that all who were fortunate enough to be in Perth during the complete Series will always have fond memories of their visit.


